<p>PE Leader to research new ideas for PE/Sport and physical activity.</p>	<p>Research good practice and collaborate with catholic cluster group and other local/regional clusters. The school has and will actively participate in a local PE school cluster securing the services their own Sports Development Officer to liaise, engage and work alongside the LA Sports Partnership. The meetings create opportunities to forge links in the local community and to maintain discuss how to maintain School Games level (Silver Award) and how to work towards the next level (Gold Award). We have embedded the School Games Spirit of the Games Values into the school ethos and it is having a positive impact on behaviour. The school will maintain its current swimming and Ice Skating programme in upper Key Stage 2 and will take every opportunity to broaden provision. This helps identify children for diving and club swimming and competitions. School has developed a certificate system to track children's ice skating and swimming achievements. <p>Extension to after school club offers</p>	<p>Offer subsidised and free places for after school clubs for all children including identified groups. Expand the range of after school clubs available to children to provide a broader experience of a range of sports, for example indoor athletics and rugby club. Increased participation of sports clubs from hard to reach groups. <p>Children to take part in more competitions through the tournaments.</p>	<p>Children are exposed to sports at a competitive level. Allowing them to participate against others. Increasing numbers of pupils will take part in sporting events both local and borough competitions for example the borough table tennis competition and the tag rugby tournament. We are also involved in inter-school competitions with a Catholic cluster. Tournaments take place across the year including swimming, cross country, infant and junior athletics in which we are a host school. We are also a host school for the Croydon Schools Partnership girls football league. <p>Enhancing the quality of games provision for pupils.</p>	<p>Children receiving high quality teaching leading to improved attainment and achievement Staff skill and ability to teach is increased. Staff to observe and participate in the sessions to develop their skills so that they can teach this area themselves. This will help build up staff confidence. In addition coaches can help teachers to identify talented pupils and direct them appropriately. Aim to employ specialist coaches tri golf training - for all teaching staff before the end of the academic year. Engage with parents to help link with local sports clubs to help sustain interest. Purchase teacher resources to help staff with their planning.</p>	<p>Teaching resources £600</p>
<p>PE equipment both for PE within the curriculum and physical activities available at playtime and lunchtime.</p>	<p>PE leader meets with play leader and school council to discuss the impact of the break time and lunchtime play. Pupil voice is used to establish what is working well and what can be improved. PE leader replenishes and orders new equipment for sports available within the curriculum and after school clubs. It has helped to develop a wider range of skills and children experience different sports. Hire a company to carry out maintenance on the long jump pit in time for the summer term and the athletics season. Results in competitions improved. A Year 6 pupil won the Croydon Schools' Athletics title for the under 12s girls long jump event and a Year 5 pupil came second in his event. It has helped to identify gifted and talented pupils.
