Performance of disadvantaged pupils

Pupils are formally assessed each term and their progress evaluated against the targets which have been set for them in Literacy and Numeracy. We also evaluate how interventions impact on pupil confidence.

Attainment: In 2012/13, FSM pupils did not do as well as non-FSM pupils at achieving L4+ in all subjects combined. However, their average point scores were higher than non-FSM pupils in reading. FSM pupils performed significantly higher than FSM pupils nationally in reading and mathematics, and higher than FSM pupils nationally in writing. FSM pupils achieved better than non-FSM pupils in the grammar, punctuation and spelling test.

Progress: In 2012/13, all FSM pupils made the expected 2 levels of progress from KS1 to KS2 in reading. Only one pupil missed this target in writing and mathematics.

Summary of PPG spending in 2012/13

Objectives in spending PPG:

- To raise standards in writing.
- To support pupils in reaching their individual targets in Literacy and Numeracy.
- To meet the social and emotional needs of pupils so that they can access the curriculum.

Summary of spending and actions taken:

- 1:1 tuition in Literacy and Numeracy
- Running intervention programmes e.g. Early Literacy Support (ELS)
- Training for Emotional Literacy Support assistant
- Additional teacher for Year 6 SATs booster groups
- Supporting parents with payments for activities such as ice-skating, day trips and residentials.
